## **READ Psalm 14:2-3 and 1 John 1:8-9.**

- What do these verses say about the state of all humans? To what extent do you agree with this?
- With these verses in mind, should we be surprised when people act in an immoral or sinful manner?
- What hope do these verses give for humanity?



Read the following quote from Christopher Hitchens from his 2007 best-selling book God Is Not Great, and write a short response to these words, based on the content in the video segment.

> "Religion has caused innumerable people not to just conduct themselves no better than others, but to award themselves permission to behave in ways that would make a brothel keeper or an ethnic cleanser raise an eyebrow. ... As I write these words, and as you read them, people of faith are in their different ways planning your and my destruction, and the destruction of all the hard-won human attainments that I have touched upon.
